The ballot you received in the mail is your official ballot. **Do not throw your ballot away!** Make sure your vote counts by putting it in the mail (postmarked) by Monday, August 14 or by dropping it off at the voter service center before 8:00 PM on August 15. All registered Republicans should have received a ballot with both the 3rd Congressional race and the Vineyard Mayoral Primary. All other voters should have received a ballot with just the Vineyard Mayoral Primary.

No Trespassing

We find ourselves facing new challenges and concerns as Vineyard's explosive growth continues. There have been numerous complaints received by the City pertaining to illegal dumping, trespassing and encroachment.

Vineyard has a large amount of vacant land, vacant lots, agricultural land and open space. There may not be a visible established boundary line from property to property and ownership may not be clear. Even though there may not be anyone residing on a vacant lot or land, crossing onto private property owned by another is trespassing and is punishable by law. As property owners install landscaping, fences, fire pits and other improvements to their lot, it is very important that you know your legal property line. Having a survey done by a third-party is the most accurate way to confirm your property boundaries. Please be courteous to other property owners. Although there may be no malicious intent dumping, encroaching or accessing someone else's property without permission is trespassing and is illegal.

Vineyard's Public Safety department has made a few changes! We would like to welcome Sargeant Holden Rockwell to Vineyard! Currently the city has one Sargent and three deputies. Although wind is not generally a big problem in Vineyard, it has caused destruction. On May 19, 1971, a strong wind (perhaps a tornado) demolished Rex Blake's hay barn. Very little other damage came from the storm. But several years later, June 8, 1878, the barns of Lynn Holdaway, Glen and Ray Holdaway and J. Rulon Gammon blew down during another fierce storm.
